'Entry level' and 'intermediate' books on insects

There is no point in trying to get a comprehensive list of British insect books together. So many of them are highly technical or complex, enough to baffle even the relative expert. As someone develops an interest in particular groups, they will come across further references to increasingly obscure and arcane papers published in scientific journals; they may also decide to invest in expensive modern monographs or even more expensive antiquarian books.

So here is a list of books that I think might be useful to the *novice* British entomologist. It is, I admit, a personal list, and it's just a taster.

- Barnard, P.C. 2011. *The Royal Entomological Society Book of British insects*. Wiley-Blackwell. Intermediate/ advanced. Order-by-order break-down with extensive further references to identification guides and other scientific publications.

Ephemeroptera, mayflies

Harker, J. 1989. *Mayflies*. Naturalists' Handbooks 13. Richmond Publishing. Intermediate. Concise, but contains illustrated identification keys and some colour pictures.

Odonata, dragonflies

Orthoptera, grasshoppers, crickets etc

- Southwood, T.R.E. & Leston, D. 1959. *Land and water bugs of the British Isles*. Warne. Entry level/ intermediate. Long out of print and hugely expensive second-hand, but available as CDRom from Pisces Publications.
- Unwin, D. 2001. *A key to families of British bugs*. Field Studies Council. Entry level. Illustrated identification guide, but only to family level.
